Re: *The Barbotte Asai Duo*, pioneers of a groundbreaking genre that integrates Classical and Jazz piano, announces their first tour in Paris, New York, Tokyo and Kobe in 2014/2015.

"A new style of piano duo by a classical pianist in Paris and a jazz pianist in New York"



April 18, 2014 New York — *De Trois Cities Records* introduces their newly born 2-piano ensemble, The *Barbotte Asai Duo*, as they launch their first tour in Paris, New York, Tokyo and Kobe in 2014/2015. The creative duo connects the talents of Parisian Classical Pianist Masaé Gimbayashi-Barbotte and New York Jazz Pianist Takeshi Asai to introduce an innovative new genre of music.

The secret to the *Barbotte Asai Duo's* unique genre lays in the originality of their musical partnership. At each concert, Masaé Gimbayashi-Barbotte, a Classical Pianist and Takeshi Asai, a Jazz Pianist, improvise in tandem, creating a collage of harmonious moments impossible to duplicate. Their joint improvisations unfold spontaneously before the eyes of the audience creating a work of art that can only exist in real time.

As Masaé and Takeshi take the stage behind facing grand pianos anticipation runs high. Neither the performers nor the audience can predict what music the night will bring. From the first stroke of the key, the *Barbotte Asai Duo* leads the audience on a musical journey. Each piano sings to the other, a dialogue of interwoven melodies. Listeners may hear elements of blues, all ages of classical music and even some French and Japanese folk songs, as well as elements from each artist's musical vocabulary, as they are juxtaposed one against the other. Both Masaé and Takeshi are guided by immense talent and intuition. Yet it is ultimately the way the duo collaborates, the way they inspire each other's music that elevates these performances from original to magical.

The two-piano ensemble is not a novelty and dates back to the time of Mozart. Yet the *Barbotte Asai Duo* is historically unprecedented. Masaé Gimbayashi-Barbotte, a classical pianist and Takeshi Asai, a jazz pianist are far from each other on the musical spectrum. How, then, is it possible for them to create music together? When a puzzled concert manager posed this question of the Duo, Takeshi replied, "Improvise!" And that is what Masaé and Takeshi actually do. No need for rehearsals or talks before they perform for the audience, says Takeshi, "all they need are good ears to recognize the pitches their counterpart has just played and in turn, to respond to what they hear". This is not nearly as simple as they make it sound. Composing instantaneously in this fashion requires unlimited virtuosity on piano, strong musicality and a touch of serendipity all their own.

Serendipity was certainly on their side when Masaé and Takeshi met by mere chance of the wind in Paris last summer when Takeshi was traveling across France on his own jazz tour. Although the two pianists reside in differing countries, Masaé in Paris and Takeshi in New York, they are united by their Japanese origin. Takeshi clarifies,

however, their successes were not, "made in Japan". After graduating from one of the finest colleges in Japan with a degree in French Literature, Masaé found a miraculous opportunity to go to Paris to pursue her dream of becoming a pianist. It was there where her music talents were nurtured by the world-class faculty of l'Ecole Normale de Musique de Paris. For Takeshi, it was Boston's Berklee College of Music where his talent was discovered. As Takeshi found his way to New York, his musicality has blossomed among the first-rate jazz musicians.

With their struggling young days behind them, the two pianists have individually earned wonderful reputations as a concert pianist and a jazz pianist in their respective countries. According to French critiques, Masaé is described as "musical" and a "true artist" with "piano tones like gems". In the eyes of New York's critics Takeshi is referred to as a "genius," "phenomenal" and an "amazingly fluid pianist".

"Genre is not a boundary," says Takeshi of the *Barbotte Asai Duo*. This is the axis of the vision of Takeshi's innovative record label, *de Trois Cités Records*.

The *Barbotte Asai Duo's* upcoming tour promises to be an opportunity for the two to work their miracles, entertaining new audiences with evenings of music unsurpassed in beauty and originality. The world tour of Barbotte Asai Duo kicks off their first concert in Paris on July 6, 2014, followed by New York, Tokyo and Kobe in 2015.
